



## HILLTOP

Hilltop is a 59 place low care facility on Hilltop Drive (enter through Tranby Way, off Hayman Road).

Hilltop opened in 1965 and its location atop the hill gives its name.

Thorough maintenance ensures this beautiful home remains modern, open and friendly for residents and visitors alike.

Hilltop comprises three 'wings' of 59 resident rooms with private ensuite bathrooms of which two rooms are 'double' (providing for couples). Each wing has a communal dining area and there is a large central activities room.

## TRINITY

Trinity is a 52 place low care facility on the corner of Rivergum and Tranby Way (entrance off Hayman Road).

Trinity is part of the Rowethorpe site in Bentley.

Opened in 1982, Trinity as the name suggests is strongly associated with the power of three:

- The building having three wings
- Three churches coming together to form the Uniting Church
- Three churches within the city parish (one also named 'Trinity.')

Trinity is designed to house frail elderly persons needing supportive (now known as low level) care with a central communal dining room for all residents to share, activities rooms and each house set around a courtyard garden. There is also a sunken garden where barbecues are held by Rowethorpe residents

48 of the rooms have private ensuite bathrooms while the remaining four are shared between two.

## ROWETHORPE

Set amidst 32 acres of lush gardens and located in the heart of Bentley, just off Hayman Road, Rowethorpe offers a range of accommodation and service options.

In fact, Residential Care is just part of the larger Rowethorpe site which incorporates community care, day therapy, independent living and cottage respite as part of the national respite for carers program.

Currently, over 450 residents call Rowethorpe 'Home' whilst a further 162 clients, living in their own homes in the community, enjoy services provided by Uniting Community Care Services, Rowethorpe.

Many on-site facilities are available and Rowethorpe is conveniently located close to shopping amenities, together with easy access to public transport.

## RESIDENTIAL CARE

There are three low band facilities (hostels) and one high band facility (nursing home) providing a total of 257 residential places at Rowethorpe.

The services provided in residential care include meals; domestic services; personal care assistance (eg: showering, dressing, domestic); activities and emergency assistance. High band provides these plus nursing care.

## FEES AND CHARGES

Accommodation Bonds are payable for extra services (up to \$450,000) and may apply for low band places subject to Commonwealth guidelines. Accommodation Payments may be chargeable for high band (up to \$32.38 per day).

Fortnightly fees are levied with the minimum charge approximating 85% of the aged pension (currently \$578.76 per fortnight).

## APPLICATION PROCESS

All applicants for funded residential facilities require an ACAT (Aged Care Assessment Team) assessment.

Applicants are requested to provide a copy of the current ACAT together with the UCH 'Application for Permanent or Respite Accommodation in a UCH Residential Care Facility' form and Centrelink Assets Assessment.

Applicants are welcome to apply at more than one UCH facility. If you wish to do this, please send your application form and documents to one facility, indicating all facilities you wish to apply for.

## ANNESLEY

Annesley is our newly purpose-built 104 place mixed residential care facility comprising:

- 20 Extra Service
- 44 High Care
- 20 Low Care Dementia Specific (including 1 respite)
- 20 High Care Dementia Specific (including 1 respite)

Annesley's predecessor, John Wesley House was built at Rowethorpe in 1974 and operated as a 'wing' of the Rowethorpe Nursing Centre (the other wing being Charles Jenkins). This 'state of the art' facility provided high level nursing home care dementia specific care and through its life was viewed by international visitors. However, Charles Jenkins eventually closed due to cost-prohibitive certification requirements and maintenance. Not long after, it was decided that John Wesley House would also need to be decommissioned for the same reasons. As part of the Rowethorpe Master Plan refined over many years, a 104-bed intermixed facility was built on the other side of the Rowethorpe campus on the site where Claudia Hicks Lodge and the Cottage Units had stood.

Named for John Wesley's Mother, Susanna Annesley, the new facility was opened in 2006 and comprises three 'wings' which all have spacious resident communal lounges and dining areas.

## CYGNET

Cygnnet is a 42 place dementia-specific low care facility situated on the Rowethorpe site on Wattle Avenue (off Hillview Terrace).

The original development at Rowethorpe was designed to accommodate those who became 'less than active' and as a result, Claudia Hicks Lodge was built in 1962. However, the passing years saw the Lodge reach a stage where it needed such significant upgrade, it was best replaced with a brand new building.

Several old cottages facing Hillview Terrace were demolished to make way for the new facility and Cygnnet was opened in 1992, named for the small ship which in 1833 brought Methodists to the Swan River Colony.

Cygnnet is designed with a homelike appearance, not unlike any residential home in the suburbs, very spacious individual rooms with private ensuite arranged into three 'Houses' clustered around a central courtyard garden and activities area.

Originally designed to accommodate both general low care and dementia specific residents, it became clear up to 2006 that demand for dementia specific accommodation was greatly increasing and so building works were undertaken to improve the facility and secure it in readiness for all 42 beds to provide this special care.
